


D20 DICE PAPER PIECE PATTERN

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Block Size:

Block will finish at 8" x 8" when sewn into a quilt project. Unfinished block is 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ "




Printing Tips:

Print foundation paper piecing pattern pages on a lightweight paper. I like "Papers For Foundation Piecing" by "That Patchwork Place" available from Amazon.com. This is a lightweight paper and it's easy to remove after piecing is completed.

Print pattern pages in **Portrait** and select "Actual Size" or 100% scale.

Confirm size by measuring the long straight edge of piece 'A'. This edge should **measure 8** ¹/₂". If it does not measure 8-1/2" on your printout, check your print options.



) Measure your printout! This side on 'A' piece must measure 8-1/2" to get a full 8-1/2" square pieced block.

Sewing Order:

After paper piecing the 3 sections, sew them together in this order.

B -> C A -> BC

Fabric Colors:

The colors in this design were selected to show better on a printout. To get the 3D look, I recommend using four shades of a color for the dice. Use a contrasting color for the background.

Select shades of one fabric color to get 3D look. The colors in the pattern match to:

Yellow - Very Light Green - Light Red - Medium Grey/Black - Dark Blue/Purple – Background

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Sewing Tips:



- When sewing the three pieces together, match the seams in the dice more than the edges of the block. This will help the points in the dice match up.
- When sewing the block, leave extra background fabric extending past the end of the seam allowance as you sew. This is just in case your pattern printed a bit smaller. You can trim to 8-1/2" at the end.
- Square up the block to 8 ¹/₂" after sewing.
